Here is the regional update on ICD/YBD movement work done in your region and what is remaining as part of the 2030 Vision.

Analysis & Strategy

Based on the analysis of the top 6 Indian states (Telangana, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Odisha, Tamil Nadu) which each had more than 400 ICD/YBD website new user visits so far:

- Irrespective of the political party in power (NDA, UPA, Other regional parties);
- % of Christians in those 6 states (1, 1.3, 1.7, 1.8, 6.7, 12.5),
- 6 different official regional languages (Telugu, Marathi, Kannada, Odia, Tamil)

- The common pattern between all of these 6 states is there were at least two regional ambassadors (2, 3, 6, 7, 13, 16). So we need your help in identifying Ambassadors like yourself in each of the 8 districts in Mizoram.

- There is a good awareness of the ICD/YBD movement in Urban areas, additionally, we need to reach out to rural areas & the youth (Facebook, Instagram & Twitter).

- One of the ways to reach out to rural areas is to write articles in local newspapers, magazines, journals and blogs about the ICD/YBD Movement & 2023 theme of 'Celebrating the impact of Christian Education in the development of modern India'.

Some examples to include in the article (please do more research for your respective state)

- Identifies the names of the oldest and/or most influential schools & colleges
- Their year of establishment,
- Notable alumni & their achievements,
- The unique contribution of that educational institute to the society
- Name of the language & Date of local language dictionary published by Christians
- Translation of major non-Christian documents from local language to English & vice versa.

Do refer to the ICD/YBD website to include the 'Declaration of 3rd July', 'ICD/YBD Movement vision', 'Significance of 3rd July', the 'Decade of celebration' messages, and a link to the ICD/YBD website in those articles and press releases.

Publishing the articles in the local language before the 3rd July may attract people to the celebration of the ICD/YBD movement as well as spread awareness about it.
